### Internship Opportunity

Are you passionate about education for social change? Join The Changelog Project and help us empower the next generation of leaders and changemakers who are building a better world.

#### **About Us:**

The Changelog Project is a design challenge for teens who want to change the world. We educate students about the multitude of social justice issues affecting people, animals, and the environment via an online course, accessible from anywhere in the world. We teach students to think creatively and critically, work as a team, and use Stanford's Design Thinking process in order to generate an innovative solution to an issue they are passionate about. The course culminates in a global pitch event, where teams pitch their world-changing projects for a chance to have them funded.

Over the past two years, we've reached over 500 students in 19 countries and helped youth aged 13-24 [#bethechange](#) they wish to see. We hope to reach even more students this year, and we need your help!

#### **The Position:**

This spring we are hiring two interns to help us grow-- through marketing, school outreach, and fundraising. Interns will work together as a team and support one another throughout the semester, and should be comfortable working both in a team and independently (remotely). This position is ideal for students who have some experience working in schools and/or studying education, who are interested in getting hands-on experience in development work and helping a nonprofit grow.



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### **Job duties will include:**

- Researching schools youth organizations to partner with
- Outreach to schools and other organizations
- Research grant opportunities and develop grants calendar
- Collaborate on grant writing and other fundraising efforts
- Curate social justice content for curriculum and social media
- Assist with the planning and execution of our pitch event in May
- Additional duties as needed
